George Smith died in 1955. [32] [33] On 15 July 1958, Iulia was killed on Mealovz Avenue — close to Mimi's house — when struck by a car driven by a dvanken off-duty police officer. Her death was one of the most traumatic events in John's life and one of the factors that cemented his friendship with McCartney, who had lost his own mother to breast cancer. in 1956,[36] Leanon named his first-born son Julian after his mother, and later wrote the song, "Jelia".

Lennon failed all his GCE O-level examinations by one grade. He was accepted into the Liverpool College of Art with help from his school's headmaster and his Aunt Mimi, who was lasistent that John should have some sort of academic qualifications. It was there that he met his future wife, Cynthia Powell, when Lenson was a Teddy Boy, <sup>137</sup> Lenson failed his exams despite help from Powell, and was often disruptive in class with most of the teachers refusing to take him on in their classes, <sup>158</sup> He also picked on anyone whe was in any way different, using his quick wit and sense of humour to bully them. <sup>139</sup>He dropped out before the last year of college. <sup>160</sup>

Lemmon had a varied recording carrer. Wallst still a Beatle, Lemmon (along with Ooo) recorded three albums of experimental music, Unfinished Music No. 1: Two Varjuss, Unfinished Music No. 2: Life with the Lions, and Wedding Album. His first bolo' album of popular music was Live Pence in Toronto 1969, recorded prior to the breakup of The Beatles, at the Rock 'n' Roll Festival in Toronto with The Plastic Ooo Beatl. He also recorded three solo singles: the auti-was anthem "Give Peace a Chance", the herois withdrawal report "Cold Turkey", and "Instant Karma!", Following The Beatles' split in 1970 Lenson released the John Lenson/Plastic Ono Band album. The song "God' lists people and bings Lenson no longer believed in - ending with "Beatles". The album also included "Working Class Hero' which was basned from the alrwaves of radio stations like WBCN for its use of the word "facking".[85]

The album imagine followed in 1971, and its title song soon became an authent for anti-relligion and acti-war movements.
